

Thank you for your interest in leaving a gift in your will to Save the Children.

If you wish to make a change to your current will, a simple addition called a codicil - is all you need. Speak to your lawyer about how to add a codicil into your will.

1.	Specific, unrestricted: I give, devise and bequeath to Save the Children the sum of \$ to be used for any purpose(s) approved by the Board of Directors of Save the Children.
2.	Specific, restricted with escape clause: I give, devise and bequeath to Save the Children the sum of \$ to be used for the following purpose(s) If Save the Children is unable to apply all or part of these funds for the specific purpose(s) stated herein, the balance of this bequest not so extended may be used for any purpose approved by the Board of Directors of Save the Children.
3.	General % unrestricted: I give, devise and bequeath to Save the Children% of the residue of my estate to be used for any purpose(s) approved by the Board of Directors of Save the Children.
4.	General %, restricted with escape clause: I give, devise and bequeath to Save the Children,% of my estate to be used for the following purpose(s) If Save the Children is unable to apply all or part of these funds for the specific purpose(s) stated herein, the balance of this bequest not so extended may be used for any purpose(s) approved by the Board of Directors of Save the Children.
5.	Residual contingent trust: Upon the death of the survivor of my (wife, husband, etc.) and my (son, daughter, etc.), I direct my trustee to transfer and deliver the balance of the residue of my Estate, including any undistributed income to Save the Children to be used for any purpose(s) approved by the Board of Directors of Save the Children.
