Children around the world are facing a triple-threat to their rights from conflict, climate change and food insecurity. Since the COVID-19 pandemic, an already dire situation has intensified, especially for deprived children in marginalized areas. Girls and refugee and displaced children are particularly at risk. These children in crisis are living in conditions with limited to no access to food, education, healthcare, and protection. The effects of the pandemic have lasting consequences, which have the potential to reverse decades of progress that has been made for the rights of children.

We must move quickly to ensure these children in crisis are reached and supported. We cannot let an entire generation of the world's children be left behind.

It is estimated that some

235 MILLION

people will need humanitarian aid this year

40% INCREASE SINCE 2020

and an estimated half will be children.

An entire generation of children

will be affected from

BEING OUT OF SCHOOL

which also significantly increases the risk of child abuse, exploitation, child marriage or children dropping out of school permanently.

GIRLS

in particular, are at a higher risk of gender based violence from not being in school.

There is a large amount of children

on the brink of acute and severe malnutrition due to

DANGEROUS FOOD SHORTAGES

FAMINE

in many countries, including Yemen, DRC, South Sudan, and parts of Nigeria.



There is a huge funding gap for

HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE GLOBALLY

with only **half of global appeals filled in 2020**. If the global community, including Canada, doesn't step up to fill this gap in 2021 the consequences for children will be enormous.



"I wish I could go back to my school and village; I wish with all my heart that the war stops."


Sarah* and her family fled their home from deadly airstrikes, making them displaced since the beginning of the war in Hodeidah. She is unable to attend school to access an education, which is keeping her behind.



Hasan* and his brother Kareem* – Hasan is 9 and lives with his parents and brother Kareem. The entire family live in makeshift camp with basic conditions in Idlib, Syria. Hasan's school was targeted during a shelling, killing one of his friends and injuring another.
